I look forward to a great Rotary year!
















TALLATION 3rd July 2022 | THE PARK, Kolker

10000 Mangrove Saplings Planted to Save Coastal Areas of the Sundarbans












Team Avyanna led by Club President Rtn Sheela Janakiram, took on a Mega Plantation Drive on 23 July 2022 at the Bali island of the Sundarbans, West Bengal. It was a major reforestation attempt with the Club organising the Planting of 10000 Mangrove saplings in the area, to secure the vulnerable embankments of the island. It is undoubtedly the need of the hour to contribute towards a healthier environment and reduce carbon footprint.



The team was greeted by the local women involved in the plantation drive with bougainvillea and madhobilata flower bunches and chandan. The Members then set the project into action by planting a few saplings themselves, post which the local women took over.

The Plantation Project of 10000 saplings which was started on 23rd July 2022 was completed in a phased manner by 26 July 2022 which coincided with WORLD MANGROVE CONSERVATION DAY.

The series of recent cyclones in Bengal, have washed away large parts of the









Sundarban mangroves and it was the Club's dream mission to rehabilitate the areas. The members are excited to have successfully completed the project.

The project was monitored by the local Social worker, Prasenjit, of The Sundarban Foundation, who regularly kept the Club updated on the progress of the plantation. with pictures, thereby making it a truly seamless and satisfying endeavour!

A simple HPV vaccine, administered between the age of 11 to 26 years, can eliminate the risk of Cervical Cancer to which mostly women fall victim.

Around 37 adolescent girls of Ward 92 were vaccinated on the day of the project, which was initiated by Cancer Foundation of India, an NGO run by our very own Club Service Project Committee (Medical), Rtn Sutapa Biswas. The project was, of course, supported spontaneously by the Club members, led by President Rtn Sheela Janakiram.

























Basic Education and Literacy

Communicating Rotary

ver since the Rotary International was formed in 1905, it has delivered path breaking services to humanity. And as the Rotary Founder, Paul Harris had said, "Whatever Rotary may mean to us, to the world it will be known by the results it achieves". True, they are known for the results, be it Polio Eradication or the running of a school for the under privileged in a slum area. However, there is a constant need to communicate the community services they have been providing to the communities across the globe. This seems to be area that needs serious focus because while the various projects are reported and discussed in detail inside the Rotary, much needs to be done generate awareness to the "publics" at large.

I remember almost two decades ago when Rtn. Virender Jain was DG of Rotary District 3010, I was invited to breakfast at his residence to discuss what can be done to communicate Rotary. PDG Jain's father was a political leader in the post independence era and therefore he was politically well connected. I had suggested to him to push for a Republic Day tableaux on Republic Day, with the famous Polio Drop and if all Districts in India pitched in, it would be a big bash. Such ideas are

received with a round of applause but they never see the light of the day. True, Rotary would never spend money to "advertise" in media, but with social media access available to all communicating logistics become easy. In fact, a number of RCs had taken the initiative to develop their own websites when we hit the www world. Unfortunately, committees change and many such websites are never renewed since the new committee is not quite web oriented and the efforts languish. The same can be said about their presence in social media. Sparks, flashes, but no planned process and worse, the audience are still Rotarians.

The task in hand is communicating with the external audience and my suggestion would be that all clubs must have a Communication Cell as much as they have a Membership, Project, Vocational Service, Interactors, Rotaractors and such other ministries. In US they also have a Committee Member who looks after PR.

What should this team actually do? Adopt the Swedish concept of GRC: Grass Route Communication.

The team actually visits various "publics" in their constituency (we know Rotary Clubs don't have a defined geographical area) but the District can break up the governing area in to constituencies and clubs made responsible for the activities in that designated area. They should have short chat shows with different audiences, from slum dwellers to students to even housewives and over tea and snacks, present to them the story of Rotary Schools, Colleges, Sports Clubs, Banks, Recreation Clubs even road shows at street corners. Not a flash in the plan, but a planned process, with dates. responsibility. And all clubs should have a budget to carry this out. Most importantly, do it silently. During the Sunday Polio period I often noticed many clubs turned it in to a carnival of sorts and after marking presence, car loads would hit the Bar.

There were exceptions and one such Rotarian I would single out was the Late PP Rtn M N Venkataraman from Delhi.

Tough call, but give it a thought. And that way we can fight the perception that Rotary is all about "self" service.

Let us create a society with better values.


