
Message from RI President** Rtn. Jennifer Jones RI President 2022-23


15th January: The 2nd Round of Virtual Spoken English Classes for Children in Rural Bengal


After the overwhelming success of the Club's pilot 'Angrezi Medium' project, the Members meticulously planned and launched the next round of the 6-month project. The project, which involves Online teaching of Spoken & Written English to children living in remote regions of rural Bengal, began on 15 January 2023.

The concept of "Each one, teach one" has shown great results. The Mentors are mostly from the city's prominent English Medium Schools & mentees from rural sectors. This is the first ever virtual blended e-learning project in Kolkata.

The project has been receiving wide media coverage in several mainline dailies.
